REGIONAL COMMAND - EAST

Provincial Reconstruction Teams are part of the NATO-led [International Security Assistance Force](#) (ISAF) mission and are key instruments through which the international community delivers assistance at the provincial and district level. Due to their provincial focus, PRTs have a unique mandate to improve security, support good governance, and enhance provincial development. The combination of international civilian and military resources allow the PRT to have a wide latitude to implement their mandate.

A PRT generally covers one province in Afghanistan, but may cover more. There are currently 26 PRTs operating in Afghanistan, 13 of which are in Regional Command - East. Due to their unique composition, PRTs seek to establish an environment that is secure and stable enough for the operation of international and Afghan civilian agencies to provide development support to less secure areas. PRTs have a broad mandate that covers the following areas:

- engage key government, military, tribal, village, and religious leaders while monitoring and reporting on various political, military and reconstruction developments.
- work with Afghan authorities to provide security and support for key events such as the Constitutional Loya Jirga, presidential and parliamentary elections, and the disarmament, demobilization and reintegration of militia forces.
- assist in the deployment and mentoring of Afghan national army and police units.
- partner with the Afghan Government, the U.N., other donors and non-government organization's (NGO's) to provide development and humanitarian assistance.
